

New Table of Equivalents for Residential Designers

Regulations Passed at the June 7, 2006 Meeting of the Nevada State Board of Architecture, Interior Design and Residential Design

Regulations are effective June 28, 2006

Section 1. NAC 623.505 is hereby amended to read as follows:

623.505 An applicant for residential design registration must have a combination of at least five years of education and training; a minimum of one year must be in education and a minimum of one year must be in training. An applicant may acquire credit for education and training only under the following table:
